## CCR PHOENIX GROWS

PHOENIX - An organization designed specifically to fight anti-homosexual bills and other legislation that goes against public order, gay rights and the privacy of consenting adults, has been formed in Phoenix. Called "Citizens for Constitutional Rights" (CCR) currently numbers almost 1600 active members and is still in its formative stages. Phone calls from concerned gays and concerned citizens in the straight community are pouring in offering to donate their services as well as donations of money. The Phoenix Gay Community appears to be more concerned about the passage of the revised Criminal Code than in any other city in the State of Arizona. There should be no reason for apathy in our other cities. This legislation will have a lasting bad effect on every homosexual in the state. True, Phoenix is the Capitol and the Community there naturally feels the closeness of the legislature and Maricopa County as well as most of the northern Counties are well known for their arch-conservatism, while the southern Counties have been traditionally much more liberal. To counteract this apathy, plans are underway to establish CCR chapters in as many cities in Arizona as possible. Each chapter city will remain autonomous but will be tied together in the common cause, with information circulated through a common headquarters. As a fund raising effort, CCR Phoenix is working with several Phoenix bars in sponsoring a Disco Dance Contest. Starting last Tuesday and running through March 17th the contest will run and anyone can enter by contributing a dollar donation. The finals will be held Sunday March 20th with the winning team receiving \$100. In addition, there will be a \$25.00 prize to winners of each bar contest plus record albums for runners-up. The schedule will appear in the Phoenix Gay Calendar each week in AGN.

## TUCSON CCR BEGINS

TUCSON - In conjunction with the formation of a Tucson chapter of "Citizens for Constitutional Rights" (CCR), a dance contest will be held Thursday March 10th at 10:00 at Jekyll's and Hyde's. The dollar admission at the door will go towards the formation of our local chapter which will fight anti-homosexual legislation in our State Legislature. First prize in the dance contest will be \$25.00 and a trophy. Second prize will be \$10.00 and third \$5.00. All three finalists will represent Tucson and Jekyll's and Hyde's at the finals in Phoenix at Moon's Truck on Sunday March 20th. Get on your dancing shoes and contribute to a worthy and just cause.

## EVER BEEN ARRESTED?

TUCSON - If you have been convicted of a misdemeanor, the police record can be cleared if your sentence has been fulfilled. Last fall a state law went into effect, stating that a person only needs to file a petition to have the misdemeanor record cleared for that offense. The record may be reopened only if one is arrested for a similar offense. Another law dealing with felonies, allows one the opportunity to clear that record, but requires a court hearing on the case.

According to Tucson City Magistrate Hyman Copins, only about a dozen such petitions have been filed. The person involved can file the petition himself or can have an attorney do it for him. This is your chance to clear your record of any misdemeanor and possibly a felony which could help you in job applications etc....

## TV SERIES CANCELLED

Miami - To no one's surprise, Anita Bryant had a forthcoming talk-variety television show cancelled because of her "extensive national publicity arising from the controversial political activities she is engaged in, in Dade County. Miss Bryant had been scheduled to begin the filming of the "pilot" film of the series next week. A Southern Baptist, she has written several books with religious themes and often appeared with Billy Graham's Crusades. Her trouble began last month when she appeared before a Dade County Commission testifying against an ordinance that bans discrimination against homosexuals in housing and employment. The ordinance passed, as did a similar ordinance in Tucson recently. Miss Bryant did not give up her campaign and formed a group called "Save Our Children, Inc". The group has been trying to persuade the commission to reconsider its vote.

Miss Bryant's quotes are so interesting that we will give you a couple here to try to comprehend. "What concerns me is that by caving in to the small, but vocal (number of) homosexual activists, those who sponsor American television and other forms of entertainment will get the impression that this sick segment of society represents society on a much broader basis than it does in reality" Miss Bryant said. Another quote which is really a shocker, "Homosexuals cannot reproduce, so they must recruit, and to freshen their ranks, they must recruit the youth of America. I shall continue my fight against that recruitment" she said.

Dade County homosexual rights activists have said that they are not planning to recruit anyone. They say that all they want is to formalize their rights to open housing and employment, which is, of course, all that any homosexual group is trying for. The ordinance is an excellent one and we in Tucson should be proud that our City Council was so enlightened and joined the other cities that realize we are in the Twentieth Century.

It has a comfortable atmosphere with clean functional surroundings. Menu prices are quite reasonable and the service is quick and courteous.

They have a full Mexican menu including beer and wine. Starting off with a cheese crisp or good salad will get those taste buds going. 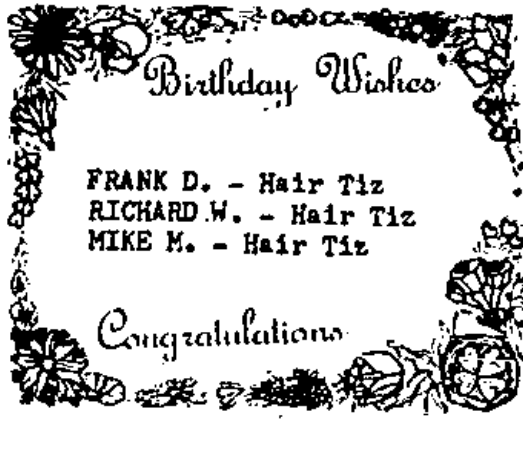
